OMAR CERRILLO GARNICA, MEMBER OF THE BOARD





XX ISA WORLD CONGRESS OF SOCIOLOGY


4701 individuals from 104 countries participated in the XX ISA World Congress of Sociology!

After the pandemic, the ISA congress in Melbourne was an opportunity to celebrate 64 fruitful years rich of activities!

RC14 PRE-CONFERENCE

RC14 has organized (care of Prof. Dimitra Laurence Larochelle –ongoing elected Secretary) in the frame of the 20th ISA congress in Melbourne, at Crown Convention Center a hybrid preconference on June 23rd and 24th, on the theme *Gender and Media: Representations, Discourses and Practices*.



Personal identity is of decisive importance for social life. Nowadays we observe a good number of reclassifications (about marriage, religion and faith, the importance of politics and of states etc.). At the same time there is a certain deliverance towards old strict gender stratifications and LGBTQ+ communities requesting their rights. This is why, the theme of gender representations in the media (TV, cinema and social media) seems of great importance for communication studies.

It is important for researchers in order 1) to record dominant mentalities and ideas about gender identities (announcing forthcoming new values); 2) to find out the popular narration (the dominant contemporary myths) disseminated by media; 3) to point out the difficulties of "difference" and of its recognition

(just to give an example, in contemporary Russia, it was reported that people of "different" sexuality are considered "ill" and must be treated, something making us think of 19th century).

In the preconference (free of charge) participated 45 speakers from 4 continents (Africa, Asia, Australia and Europe) analyzing extremely interesting themes of modernity such as sexual violence in the field of social media, women's representations and patriarchy by media in different countries such as Finland, India, Italy, Lebanon, Malaysia, Nigeria, Spain, Turkey, gender stereotypes in the movies and in television, femicides' representations by media in Greece etc. There were 40 case studies from almost all over the world, focusing on representations in social media, television and cinema. Each case study was a concrete mention and contribution to the attempt of recording the contemporary gendered sociality. The preconference lasted two full days and we cannot "report" all results here. Selected essays will be published in 2024. Still, some concluding remarks are the following:



- 1) Sexual violence is dominant in the frame of the contemporary representations
- 2) Media do not "create" but only reproduce dominant perceptions and gender stereotypes
- 3) The so called "new media technologies" (used in social media) are not vehicles of change of regnant perceptions (contrary to the popular thought which believes that new technologies create new mentalities).

The contemporary constructions of Blackness in the digital age, in which the emergent era of policing in the U.S. focuses on security and risk management and incorporates a variety of surveillance tools and technologies, such as data analytics and algorithms, compels us to think about the lessons of U.S. history concerning the role of science—particularly the social sciences—in creating associations between Blackness and criminality. All these are or have been part of the state's or empire's strategies for survival and "development." The incorporation of all these considerations in an assessment of the increasingly digitally-based approaches to policing New York City neighborhoods reveals ways in which the forces of modernity/coloniality create new approaches to objectivity and develop new types of injustices.
